RENOVATE FOR PROFIT WITH CHERIE BARBER

In this episode, Cherie Barber helps 3 sisters renovate their mum and dads home who have sadly passed away.

Sisters Cathy, Caroline & Elizabeth inherited their parents unrenovated 3-bedroom home at a time when the Sydney property market is in rapid decline. With properties failing to sell, they decide to embark on a whole house, quick cosmetic renovation in the hope of differentiating their property from all others to snag that all important, buyer. The stakes are high and the pressure is on with property prices dropping by the week.

KEY JOBS







Cherie's renovation strategy was a whole house cosmetic renovation, focusing the budget primarily on the internals of the house with less money on the externals.

The primary internal scope of works included:

- Installation of a brand-new bathroom (unplanned cost);
- Cosmetically refresh the existing kitchen including new benchtops;
- Install new kitchen in the granny flat;
- New waterproof laminate floorboards throughout;
- Internal painting throughout (done DIY by the sisters);
- Update all electricals including new lights, switches & ceiling fans;
- Update all electricals at the electrical switchboard level;
- Install new window furnishings (white venetians, curtains & rods);

(INTERNAL WORKS CONTINUED)

- Repair sagging ceilings in dining room & granny flat area;
- Structurally repair damaged flooring in dining room area;
- Cosmetically refresh the existing sunroom;
- Disconnect & remove old aircon in master bedroom & patch walls;
- Fix weird electrical configurations throughout the home;
- Remove old fireplace in the lounge room & patch walls;
- Cosmetically refresh the existing granny flat bathroom;
- Remove old fixtures from the laundry area;
- Install wallpaper feature wall in main lounge room area;

The primary external scope of works included:

- Change colour on existing external window frames;
- Remove unsightly carport walls & associated fit-out;
- Spray paint all existing boundary fencing for uniformity;
- Remove some of the existing plants & replace with new plants;
- Jackhammer old concrete pathways from rear yard;
- Remove 1 x old garage shed;
- Install new woodchips to all garden beds;
- Install new turf to areas where old concrete paths located.

SALE NOTES:

- The decision to renovate the house was a strategic one to increase the chances of securing a potential buyer at a time when hardly any properties are selling in the current property market cycle. If the 3 sisters had listed the house in its unrenovated state, chances were high that a buyer could not be obtained. By way of comparison, the neighboring property immediately next door (which is similar & unrenovated) has been on the market for \$550,000 for over 1 year without a sale.
- As soon as the renovation was complete, the property was listed immediately for sale.
- The property sold immediately to a buyer who came through the first open for inspection.
- The 3 sisters could have held out for a better offer however with the Sydney property market in decline mode, decided to sell quickly at the property valuation price.
- From the outset of this renovation, all parties knew that very little profit was to be made on this project. More so, for the 3 sisters involved, it was emotional closure on a property where cherished family memories were once had.

FOOD WITH MIGUEL MAESTRE

Miguel visits The Little Marionette, one of Sydney's best roasteries in Rozelle to learn why Australian coffee culture is one of the world's best. Fuelled by all the caffeine, Miguel prepares a mocha choc chip cookie to go perfectly with a cup of coffee.

MIGUEL'S MOCHA CHIP COOKIES

Prep time: 15 minutes plus chilling Cooking time: 12 minutes

Makes: 60 mini cookies

Ingredients

120g salted butter, at room temperature

50g caster sugar

100g brown sugar

- 2 tsp instant coffee powder
- 1 egg, at room temperature
- 1 vanilla bean, scraped

240g plain flour

- 1/2 tsp baking powder
- Pinch of sea salt flakes
- 170g good quality dark chocolate chips





Method

- 1. Using electric beaters, cream butter, sugars and coffee powder together until light and fluffy and powder has dissolved. Add egg and vanilla. Beat well.
- 2. Combine flour, baking powder and a pinch of salt. Fold the dry ingredients into the butter mixture until it just comes together. Fold in the chocolate chips.
- 3. Lay out a length of baking paper. Place cookie dough in centre of the paper, using your hands to shape it into a rough log. Fold baking paper in half over the dough.
- 4. Holding the bottom of the baking paper with one hand, press a pastry scraper into the crease that forms between the dough and the baking paper. Move the scraper back and forth to even out the cylinder until it has a diameter of around 4cm, leaving space at the end of the paper for wrapping.
- 5. Tightly wrap the baking paper around the cylinder and firmly twist ends together to form tight seal.
- 6. Chill dough in fridge for at least 30 minutes. Alternatively the dough can be frozen to use later.
- 7. Preheat oven to 180C.
- 8. Slice chilled dough into 2cm thick rounds. Line a baking tray and lay out dough slices, leaving some space between them, as they will grow during baking.
- 9. Bake for about 12 minutes, until lightly golden and cooked through.
- 10. Allow to cool for a couple of minutes before moving to a wire rack to cool.
- 11. Serve with a cup of coffee.
