# **INSTRUCTIONS**

## Getting on the Roof

Always make sure you wear a harness and are securely anchored to the roof before getting on it to clean or do other jobs.

- 1. Make sure the ladder is 1 metre out from the wall and 1 metre past the gutter.
- Always wear a harness and have something really secure to attach it to. Always follow product instructions.
- 3. Please be aware of any water restrictions in place in your current state.

### Deep Root Soaker

### To make the pipe

- 1. Wrap the tape in the direction of the thread
- 2. Screw the t-section onto the end
- 3. Next screw on the tap section refer to the arrow that will show you the direction of water flow and make sure this is going into the pipe. Make sure the tap is sideways so you don't hit it with the hammer.
- 4. Follow with the reducer and the hose fitting
- 5. Before you add the brass capping to the bottom, drill some fine holes in the bottom, so the water can spread out.

#### Creating drill holes

- 1. Use a centre punch to make a dent where you want to drill.
- 2. Use a drill to make small holes in the bottom of the pipe.
- 3. Add the brass capping to the bottom and stake into the ground where you wish to water the roots.

### **DIY Drink Station**

- 1. Fix castors onto the bottom of the wine barrel
- 2. To add extra support, cut a piece of ply so it fits nicely in the bottom, then screw the centre post into place.
- 3. Create a round hole in the side to place the brass tap fitting in, to ensure drainage when the ice melts
- 4. Add your own fixtures and cross members to create whatever style drinks stand you like.





## Summer Garden Tips

- 1. Prepare your soil If you have soil where the water just runs straight off, it means it's Hydrophobic it doesn't accept water into the soil. Use a garden fork to dig up the soil and mix in some organic matter and compost it will help to enrich the soil so it can absorb the water. Use around 40-50mm of a fine mulch this will help to suppress weeds and insulates to help it all year round. Add mulch 2 times a year for best results.
- 2. Protect new plants While Autumn is the best time of year to plant you can still plant in summer and if you are doing so be diligent with the water. Plant under an existing tree and use a small hand spade so as not to damage the roots. Use appropriate plants and then surround them with mulch to keep water in the soil.
- 3. Deep Soil Watering Using the deep root soaker that Barry created. Attach a hose and hammer into the ground 300-400mm down and then turn on slightly, to into the soil.
- 4. Shade Delicate Plants it's important to keep potted plants in shade during summer. Use a trolley to relocate your larger potted plants to different areas and cover up the trolley by layering different sized pots in front.
- 5. Rehydrate your pots Fill a bucket of water and add a seaweed solution and some wetting agent and place the whole pot with the plant in the bucket. The water will slowly soak back through the soil. With indoor plants use a chopstick to poke around the soil in order to create new avenues for the water to travel through.

# Antarctica – Ice Expedition

Sub-zero temperatures; icy water; potential hypothermia.

It doesn't sound like many people's idea of a nice summer holiday, but it's the best time of year to visit Antarctica.

That's where Dr Chris Brown spent the week, exploring one of the most wild, remote and pristine environments in the world.

The majority of Antarctica is made up of a vast permafrost ice sheet which averages 2000 metres in thickness, and only two per cent of the continent is free from ice.

It holds about 90% of the world's ice and 70% of the world's fresh water, and has also been one of the most rapidly warming parts of the planet over the last 50 years.

Late October and November is the best time to see Antarctica at its most undisturbed, while penguins begin hatching in December and whale watching is at its best from mid February.

Tourism to Antarctica is managed by the International Association of Antarctica Tour Operators (IAATO), which works to ensure promote environmentally responsible travel to the region.

Chris travelled there with Aurora Expeditions, where he was able to explore the peninsula with experienced guides committed to the sustainability of Antarctica.

# FOOD WITH MIGUEL MAESTRE Anna Gare Fremantle Seafood BBQ

With nearly 13000km of coastline, and the most of any state or territory in Australia, Western Australia has a diverse bounty of unique and delicious seafood.

Keen to get his hand on some of Australia's freshest and most prized seafood Miguel goes straight to the source – Fremantle's Fishing Boat Harbour. Who better to show him around than local Anna Gare.

Anna and Miguel head to Bather's Beach to cook up a BBQ seafood platter with a roasted capsicum salsa.

Prep time - 25 minutes

Cooking time – 45 minutes

Serves – 4

#### Ingredients

- 1 head garlic, finely chopped
- 1 small knob ginger, finely chopped
- 2 long red chillies, chopped
- 125mL extra virgin olive oil

Salt and pepper

- 2 fillets goldband snapper, skin scored, cut into 5cm thick strips
- 6 green tiger prawns, butterflied
- 3 squid, cleaned and scored
- 3 legs Fremantle octopus, legs cut into 5cm lengths
- 6 scallops, roe removed, on the shell
- 2 medium zucchini, cut into half moons
- 3 pattypan squash, cut into wedges
- 1 red capsicum, deseeded, cut into 4 thick strips
- Spanish onion, cut into large dice





3 long red chillies, whole

Juice of 1 lemon

### Capsicum and chilli paste

Charred capsicum, from above

Charred chili, from above

½ cup blanched almonds

1 garlic cloves

Juice of ½ lemon

1/4 cup extra virgin olive oil

Salt and pepper

#### Method

- 1. Preheat BBQ to maximum heat
- 2. Make marinade by combining garlic, ginger, chilli and extra virgin olive oil in a large bowl.
- 3. Toss the seafood and vegetables in the marinade and spread all out onto the preheated BBQ. Cook until charred and cooked through.
- 4. Squeeze lemon juice over the cooked seafood and vegetables and season.
- 5. Arrange the cooked seafood on a platter, picking out the charred chilli and capsicum.
- 6. Using a mortar and pestle, pound together the charred, capsicum, chilli, blanched almonds, garlic cloves, lemon juice and olive oil to form a paste.
- 7. Serve the paste with the BBQ seafood.
